Congratulations

A highlight of the year was the induction of Ali Pickett into the WA Football Hall of Fame. Ali will probably be the last player that has only ever played WAFL football to get this great recognition.

The Presidents Trophy was awarded to Brent Irving who was invaluable in multiple roles including the welfare support to our players, bench coach and team manager to name but a few of his many support roles.

Brent is now our foreign correspondent through his work commitments but has been an important cog in our success story and is a worthy recipient of this year's President's Trophy recognising excellence by the people in our club.

Well done to Captain Leigh Kitchin and his leadership group for driving our standards all year and to Zac Clark for winning the Outridge Medal. Tarni Golisano led the SFC W team and was also crowned the league Sarah Mitchell Medalist for 2023.



We have plenty to do in the women's football program but with Tarni's leadership and new coach Baker Denneman's direction, we are sure to improve rapidly.

Our Ball Legend for 2023 was Luke Newick and thanks to Luke for being available and getting involved with the club this year. Luke is another player from our successful era before 2010 that left us with so many great memories. Luke joins Aiden Parker, Mark Webb, Ali Pickett and Brad Smith from that era as ball legends.

CEO's Report

The Club entered 2023 with some clear objectives in both men's and women's football and our talent pathway and country zones.

All three men's teams played finals football and that was a big positive for the club. We didn't win a premiership or make a grand final which are really the ultimate measures of success. However, after not making league finals in 2022, this year can be seen as a steppingstone to greater competitiveness in 2024. Football is dealt with in more detail by others in this annual report.

I wrote in this report last year that our challenge at the end of last year was to rebound quickly, get the best from our experienced players while adding the enthusiasm of the younger players to the group. With both the Colts and Reserves groups having very strong years, the player pressure on the league group should continue to drive improvement. That remains our way forward in the men's game.

Women's Football

We have achieved a one club model after years of trying and we are very excited about the possibilities and there will be many benefits from a much closer relationship.

However the women's programs need some more support and focus from all of us in 2024. The girls have demonstrated they can add to the club fabric and bring energy and enthusiasm, youth and new families to our membership. We need to step up and be far more inclusive and considerate of their needs to succeed and prosper. Our joint pre-season training facilities for the talent pathway and the SFCW programs will continue to be developed and remain a key issue for us in 2024 and beyond.

SFC Operations

The small number of SFC staff do a very good job considering the lack of resources and at times cohesion and leadership in the industry, however I would like to thank everyone for their contribution.

In football, Kristian Diction, Dicks to everyone, continues to challenge and provide an important opinion, network contacts and offers a style that is able to compliment Beau and senior coaches. Stuart Berryman continues to manage the talent pathway with dedication and strong support of the key coaches and support staff.

We welcomed Joe Georgiades to the club as the Commercial Manager who will drive our key revenues of sponsorship and marketing and AFL Hospitality. Being a past player, Joe is keen to embrace that group and more will be done in that space. We will shortly appoint a Marketing Co-Ordinator to assist Joe in driving growth in membership, game day attendance and audiences. This will be through social media and other communication channels with a high priority to continue communication with members and supporters.

Karen South manages our financial area with support from Board member Luka Zivkovic and well done to both. Karen's a great team player and adds value to the club supporting games days, admission gates, functions and whatever else is needed.



Bar & Functions

Well done also to Mack Sheppard, Pauli, Alex and the rest of the hospitality team. The Weapon is all business, and he has been under pressure to drive new business, new events and functions that have boosted our turnover in bar and functions.

Some notable functions and events include the 700 person HBF Christmas function held on the oval which was excellent, the National Police Championships and Con Regan Memorial Game that supports Police Legacy. Add to that a number of quiz nights, fundraisers, celebrations and our own WAFL games days, our staff have been excellent – well done Mack and crew.

1973 Premiership 50th Reunion

Firstly, thanks to the organizing committee led by Siera. That group was instrumental in communicating with the past players and also the wider audience that attended the event. It was widely acknowledged by the players that the club did a great job honoring them and the achievement of breaking a 49-year premiership drought, still the longest in WAFL history. (Perth are approaching 47 years now!)

Lawro's Last Stand

Mark is in his final year as the Club President and announced his succession to Rusty Smith earlier this year. It's been the year of Lawro ever since and he had more final celebration events than John Farnham.

Well done to Mark, he's been a terrific support to me, a great Subi man and he will no doubt continue to sponsor and attend game days and support the club as he's done all his life.

Season Highlights

Some of the game day and event highlights during the year included;

- Hosting three weeks of WAFL finals at Leederville Oval, Qualifying Final, 1st Semi Final and finally the Preliminary final. Other than the win, Joe & Mack's outer bar was a highlight.
- ANZAC Day game in Rd3 and the return of the Andrew Christie Cup presented by Len Christie to the winner Galen Savigni.

- Life Members Day on Rd5, including presentations to newly inducted Leigh Kitchin and Brian Becker.
- Justin Langer Lunch in Kalgoorlie attracted a good cross section of business and local football officials and allowed us to talk about what we could do to better support football, coaching and participation in the Goldfields. Thanks to Justin for his time and memorable talk and to absent host Brendan Simpson and the crew at the Overland Motel.
- NAIDOC game in Rd13 that coincided with Country Week, jumper designed by Kevin Bynder, Nev Collard for his welcome to country and Gerry Matera and Gather Foods. Fiona White Hartig also obtained some excellent gift packs for all the lunch attendees.

Key Club Strategy

The future for us means we must address all the following key issues during next year and beyond.

- The Des Penman Reserve helps achieve the goal of co-location of talent and our women's programs. Installation of floodlights and a partnership with the WAFC and City of Stirling to deliver a Northeast Engagement Strategy to reinvigorate football in that area is a vital objective.
- The Leederville Oval Master Plan with East Perth and the City of Vincent is stalled and remains a key club strategy.
- I had hoped that by the end of 2021, new floodlights at Leederville would be announced. That project is still to be delivered, however East Perth, The City of Vincent, AFL and the WAFC continue to meet and discuss this project.
- Lion Foundation growth and funding sources and then an ongoing strong link and benefit stream for the SFC then incorporating a strong community engagement activation.
- Fan engagement and game day experiences to continue to grow our support base.
- SFC facility improvements at Leederville Oval including a spa for our players, extended members deck to link with members grandstand area, continue to open up the bar/function room.
- Goldfield's football, SFC's vision is to expand our football academy to assist local volunteers & grow football in the region to better integrate participation programs and support coaching and GFL clubs. Stay tuned in 2024.

Football Operations

The core function of our club is football, the staff, coaches and players that continue to set high goals, challenge each other and never take things for granted.

Our list management remains critical given our club direction to develop our players promoted from successful Colts and Reserves pathways. Every debutant in league football is a celebration of the efforts of a range of coaches and support staff and targeted recruitment like that of Zac Clark remains our focus. It's exciting to have both Greg Clark and Luke Foley return to our club and with Kyron Hayden's recovery on track we should be excited by that as well.

Talent & Development Pathway

John Mansfield slipped more or less seamlessly into the vacancy left by Chayce Creedy's move to senior football and he led the group into finals, well done and I really appreciate your efforts.

Stuart Berryman has again been outstanding as our Talent Manager and continues to provide our senior program with a flow of quality players and good people.

Senior Coach's Report

How do we reflect on season 2023?

We have seen great resilience and perseverance. We have seen great change and transition; building on the Subiaco legacy was imperative but with change comes growth. Our journey from the combat teams session at Wesley, the Amazing Race through the city, the thrown kitchen sink a literal metaphor to find more on a hot Saturday morning, we celebrated milestones, enjoyed trademark wins, and consoled with tough losses. We welcomed in new players, our transitioning colts and some familiar old faces returned to this great club.

What stayed the same in 2023 was our players and coaches drive for continued improvement and an unmatched work ethic in preparation for on-field success. We grew, enhancing our bond together, overcoming adversity and looking to bring the spirit of why we play this great game.

Whilst this season hasn't brought the much-wanted silverware, there is so much to be proud of. To be the only club having both senior teams play in Preliminary finals speaks to the depth and drive from our squad. Last year we lost six of our premiership players from 2021 however we rebounded to finish the home and away season 2nd on the ladder.

We spoke in the pre-season about the theme of the Mamba Mentality: trying to get better every day at what you're doing. This foundation led to the growth of our group from day one of pre-season and throughout 2023. Club Commercial Report

The 2023 football season was a bit of a whirlwind for myself starting in the Commercial Manager role in April with the WAFL Season underway.

In the recent decade, I have gained experience from both a football administration and in the commercial spaces of football through previous roles in the football industry and the challenge of applying those learnings at my old club was certainly appealing.

Whilst my start time in the role was probably not ideal, I certainly took many learnings out of the football season and enjoyed working as part of a small team trying to deliver some huge outcomes.

I feel the 2023 learnings will hold me in good stead to help design and deliver Subiaco's new commercial model following the exit of Subiaco Oval.

Membership

Membership is a critical component of being a successful WAFL Club and the revenue and support raised through a successful membership program can make all the difference in a team's on field performance.

Our Membership number for 2023 finished on 1203. I'd like to thank all those members who supported us Lions in 2023.

Across the WAFL, the club tracks at the lower end in terms of Club Membership Numbers (total members and membership revenue) so expect to see a huge focus on growing and servicing members in the next 12 months as we aim to grow our membership base. Growing members helps all other revenue streams including sponsorship, match day incomes, merchandise, food and beverage etc.

At the end of 2023, we carried out a membership survey which has given us some critical learnings as to what members want to see in 2024.

We feel membership growth can come through:-

1. Player's and current Member's Friends and Family
2. Families within our zoned football communities
3. Converting the existing Subiaco fan base to memberships

Subi Means Business Initiative

We created a Subi Means Business initiative this year (which is now a membership tier for people with a business) to encourage the growth of more business networking through the club leading to membership and sponsorship growth. This concept kicked off with a breakfast in July with over 100 people in attendance to listen to Club Sponsor Wally Edwards AM talk about his life and business accomplishments. If nothing else, the breakfast highlighted a group of business minded past players exists keen to reengage with the Club in a convenient Business Networking Fashion.

We also took number one ticket holder Justin Langer to Kalgoorlie for a Networking Lunch in August for the Goldfields Football fraternity and we remain hopeful that the lunch will help us secure some meaningful partnerships to carry out greater football programs in the future. Goldfields lunch was supported by Drive Personnel and Worthy Parts.





Match Days

Having seen how things operate on match days in 2023, I'm really looking forward to the 2024 football season so that we can put plans in place to maximise a) attendances and b) our returns from match days. We would also like to improve our offerings for Women's match days and get more cross over from supporters to Men's and Women's and vice versa.

Obvious match day revenues will include Gate Sales, Merchandise, Function Centre and Food and Beverage offerings, and we think there is opportunity to improve in all facets of the match day experience.

This year we experimented with the Corporate Deck affectionately known as Lawro's Lair and we will continue to look at ways to attract more 'corporate' fans to our club.

Additionally we experimented with some activations with our zoned junior Clubs on match days and we feel that there is scope to continue to ramp up those relationships to stimulate more activity at Leederville on match days.

This season Topolinis Caffe ran our canteen and did the bulk of our on premise catering and did a great job whenever they were called upon.

Sponsorship

Sponsorship revenue continues to be a major financial driver for the Club and a major focus of my role.

I'd like to recognise exiting president Mark Lawrence and his wife Deb, who through their family company Pheonix Motors (formerly Pheonix Holden) have sponsored the Club for 40 years which is surely the longest sponsorship in the Club's history.

We are also very fortunate to have had Holman Industries as our Premier Partner for five seasons and that partnership will continue into 2024. Thanks to Wally Edwards and his team for their great support.

Other longstanding commercial partners include:-

Your contribution to the Club certainly helped your player sponsored to get a complimentary membership, access to high performance coaching, some team merchandise, hospitality at the club and much more. We will continue to grow this program in 2024 to offer as much value as possible to the players and the sponsors.

Looking forward, from a commercial perspective, the Commercial team will focus our attention on:-

- Commercialising community projects
- Bringing back holiday coaching clinics
- Corporate networking events
- Promotion of Members and the Club's Function Centre, &
- Commercialising our Match Days

I'd like to close by thanking those who have supported me thus far in this role including, Subiaco FC Staff, the Board, Current Sponsors, and Club Coaches, Volunteers and Players.

We have a fair amount of work to do in the commercial space, but I believe the club has the components within its grasp to be extremely successful on and off the field provided we are all up for the challenge.
